A History

The Delta Golden Wings was established on November 16th., 1968, as a fraternal organization whose membership was to consist of Retired Pilots of Delta Air Lines and senior active pilots, age 50 to 60. The organizational meetings were held in New Orleans on November 14th, 15th and 16th with the final meeting terminating at 4:00 PM after which the meeting room doors were unlocked allowing the attendees to rejoin their wives, and the party began.

Thus it was on November 16, 1968, that the DELTA GOLDEN WINGS was born, for Retired Delta Pilots and those active pilots over 50 years of age (excerpt from the first Delta Golden Wings newsletter, Vol, 1, No.1, dated February 1969)

In 1968 Captain William J. Fry accepted his appointment as the first President of the Golden Wings along with his staff that consisted of Captain Noble "Tex" Buice, Vice President, Captain Gene Croft, Treasurer, and Captain L. Rowe Davidson, Secretary. In addition, Captain S. W. Hopkins was appointed to the position of, Director at Large.

Captain Thomas S. Bridges assumed the responsibility of Director of Public Relations, and Captain Al Lohrke became Director - Active Pilots while Captain Bud Carmicheal was appointed as Historian with an Assistant Historian, Mrs. Dodie Croft.

The Field Directors at each pilot domicile were:

Mr. Charles H. Dolson, Chairman of the Board of Delta Air Lines, was elected unanimously as the first Honorary Life Members.

It was also determined at this time that dues would be assessed at \$10.00 per year for pilots including their wives. We expect them (wives) to play a big part in our annual reunions, contributing to its

success as they have in our lives. As a matter of fact, we may ask them to provide some food for us. (Excerpt, Golden Wings Newsletter, Vol. 1, No. 1 February 1969)

All of the credit for the initial "spade work" goes to Captain Tommy Bridges (deceased) who had the idea, took the time and effort to do the mailing, make the survey, set up the first gathering, as well as treating the group to a great reception and cocktail parties at the Hilton. (Excerpt, Delta Golden Wings Newsletter, Vol. 1, No. 1 February 1969)

On Tuesday, January 21st, initial talks were held with Mr. Charlie Dolson, Mr. Dave Garrett, Mr. Wharton and Mr. Miller concerning the concept of the organization and support from Delta in the area of publishing and mailing a newsletter, to which they warmly agreed. However, the establishment of a logo pin for the pilots and their wives seems to have several obstacles to overcome.

On November 13-15, 1969, the first annual convention/reunion of the Delta Golden Wings was held at Miami Springs Villa, Miami Springs, Florida. With lots of enthusiasm registration began at a slow pace on opening

DAD'S FRIENDS-ONES I MET, AND NAMES I'M FAMILIAR WITH GROWING UP morning with the real festivities beginning that evening.

The first order of business was an impromptu mini-cocktail party just prior to the scheduled cocktail party and banquet honoring four captains that were retiring from Council #71 in Miami. Captain Truman Outland, the first DGW member to retire, and Captains Doolittle, Haas and Harwell were the guests of honor. The banquet was a joint affair of members of Council #71 and the Delta Golden Wings members and wives. The guest speaker was Captain "Pre" Ball, representing the Company. There was much fine food, excellent speeches, splendid dance music and certainly no deficiency of excitable conversation. As a matter of fact there were nearly two-hundred happy-as-clams attendees.

The last day of the reunion began for the DGW with the business meeting held in the Shag Days Room at the Villas, attended by all members and wives. The minutes and routine reports were read, followed by a few comments by President Bill Fry welcoming all to the reunion, especially our newest members. Notable in these comments was the rapid growth of the membership from ten couples at the organizational meeting in New Orleans one year ago to almost ninety couples at this time. The attendance of 42% of the membership at the reunion was most gratifying.

It was at this time that Captain Bud Carmicheal resigned as Historian and was replaced by Captain Fritz Schwaemmle.

The matter of Associate Membership was discussed at some length resulting in a change in the bylaws, as follows: ARTICLE III, Section 2, Associate Members: Strike out the words, "Dues Free."

Three new Associate Members were accepted: Mrs. Whittaker, Mrs. Holliman and Mrs. Young.

Emblem and Insignia Committee - Mike Winicki, as chairman of the committee, just did not have enough time to do justice to such an important item and has agreed to continue working until a suitable emblem/insignia is selected. All should be grateful to Mike and his committee for the job required in arriving at an appropriate design. The committee has all the plans and ideas submitted to date.

Al Bonner called from Atlanta to say that Tom Beebe had authorized Tommy Bridges to announce that Delta Air Lines retired pilots and their wives would, in the near future, be afforded reduced rate transportation on some international and domestic carriers. This was received with a big round of applause. Trans World Airlines will be the first international carrier to offer this with several others coming on line at a later date. The membership passed a resolution directing that a letter be sent to Mr. Dolson expressing our appreciation and thanks for this opportunity being granted and to also thank many others who made this benefit possible.

Thursday afternoon was devoted to playing golf, basking in the sun by the pool or taking one of several trips arranged by the wives. The tours to Parrot Jungle, Seaquarium or Viscaya Gardens were most enjoyable and/or interesting. The gracious hostesses for the delightful tours were Mrs. Buice, Mrs. Eames and Mrs. Doolittle.

Excitement and enthusiasm began to rise as the hour approached for the DGW cocktail party held in the Shag Days Room at the Villas. This was another real spark of the reunion, followed by a no-host Smorgasbord dinner at the Airways Inn just three blocks from the Villas. It was an excellent meal and all ate their fill. A rain storm came up during and after dinner, bringing into action our great "shuttle" service. This service was very popular and continued for the remainder of the reunion. Many thanks to Captains Buice, Doolittle, Eames and Outland, Mrs. Whittaker and Mrs. Holliman for the deluxe "shuttle" service.

Neither the hour of the evening nor the dampness of the night crimped the enthusiasm of the DGW reunion members but rather they seemed to inspire many to continue the revelry and fun throughout the entire night until the dawn. The first order of events Saturday morning was getting properties and possessions paired up with their rightful owners.

There was a brief Board of Directors meeting Saturday morning followed by the election of officers for President and Vice-President. Captains Bill Fry and Tex Buice were re-elected to serve for the forthcoming year. This re-election was accepted with appreciation and gratitude and with the tact understanding that neither will be available for nomination or election to an office for the year 1971.

Immediately following the election of officers, Delta Golden wings was again hose for a fine brunch at the general dining room in the Villas. This served as a sort of farewell function as it was the last official act of the reunion.

During the numerous meetings of the Executive Board on November 18-22, 1969, the following resolution was adopted:

BE IT RESOLVED; that Association policy be formulated by the Executive Committee and presented to the next Executive Board for action, and,

BE IT RESOLVED; that the Air Line Pilot magazine shall be sent to all retired pilots effective immediately.

Also from the published minutes of a later meeting of the Executive Committee held on December 16, 1969: Services to be provided retired members.

The Executive Committee reviewed the action of the Executive Board at its November 1969 meeting directing that policy be formulated by the Executive Committee on this subject for presentation to the Executive Board for action. Determining that the subject matter required more study and investigation than could be developed by the Executive Committee in session, the following resolution was unanimously adopted on a motion by Goss and was seconded by Ciancetta.

RESOLVED; that subcommittee of the Executive Committee comprised of the Vice-President of the Regions IV and V and the Secretary-Treasurer of the Association be hereby appointed to study and make recommendations to the Executive Committee concerning services to be furnished retired pilots for its review and submission to the Executive Board (excerpt, Delta Golden Wings Newsletter, Vol. 1, No. 5, April 1970)
